



- Where we will stay up to 21 days on the island
- A team of 3 operators + support team of 4 persons + remote team
- Budget is \$440,000 where 2/3 is secured already
- \$150,000 in support needed
- ALL PERMITS IN HAND

Peter I Island DX-pedition 2026 is in the progress (#8 most wanted)

There is also plans for Peter I Island in progress. We have secured a vessel, and we're now building a team of 19 operators that will go to Peter I Island in February 2026 and stay there for 14 days. The vessel is a proper Antarctica vessel with 2 helicopters, two Expedition leaders and with all permits needed. We are working closely with the Norwegian Polar Institute to obtain the landing permit. A website will be created and more information about Peter I Island DX-pedition will be released later. Fundraising is expected to start 2024

TX5S Clipperton Island DXpedition (NA-011) January 18 – February 1, 2024



Equipment Week:

During the first week of December several team members will meet in Northern California to prepare the campsite and radio equipment for shipment to our boat Shogun which is docked at San Diego. We will inventory the tents and review their installation procedures, the Elecraft transceivers will be integrated with the computers, amplifiers, and the island's WIFI environment will be configured and integrated with Starlink. The EME and satellite stations are separate turnkey packages. Shogun will provide meals on the island; we will provide the necessary campsite logistics and management.

Clipperton Island ATNO Day Planned

Clipperton remains #26 most wanted in Europe and #37 most wanted globally. It will have been 11 years since the last major DXpedition to Clipperton we know there are many people that need it for an All Time New One and band fills.

Log Uploads

We plan to upload the logs at least once a day to both Clublog and to M0URX.com
Shortly after we leave the island confirmation requests (OQRS) will be processed **only** at M0URX.com
Not in Log and busted calls will be investigated by submitting the form at M0URX.com. Please, no emails about Not in Log or busted calls, you must use the reporting form on the OQRS system.

FT8 Operation

The team will use **WSJT-X** exclusively for all FT8 operation. We plan to use Fox / Hound on non-standard frequencies. Occasionally, we might start up on a standard frequency in normal mode, then QSY. See the website for the band plan.

Groups.io Forum

The pilot team will be using Groups.io to collect input from the DX community. The process worked so well at VP8PJ we will again use it again. A Groups.io account is required to post to the group. You may subscribe to the forum by sending an e-mail to: Clipperton-2024+subscribe@groups.io

Fundraising:

The long-standing DX-pedition funding model is to split the DX-pedition cost equally between the expedition team and the DX community, i.e., organizations and individuals. TX5S donations are only at ~45% of the goal. While adding a donation to your OQRS request is always appreciated, the cash flow challenge is real, we must pay the bills before we sail, we need your help.

When I was a young ham in 1962, my Scoutmaster, John W8ELE, (Everybody Loves Elsie) Loaned me his 1936A MAC Key. At the time Ted McElroy was still alive. That key started my interest in collecting MAC keys.

When I heard the story of Theodore Roosevelt McElroy winning the code competition at the Ashville, NC hamfest in 1939, setting a record that has not been beaten, at ~75.2 wpm, I was puzzled by the notion that he used a "MILL". At the time, I asked "What's a mill?". It was explained by the story teller that a Mill is a typewriter used by Western Union operators, one of which was McElroy.






Telegrapher's portable typewriters

Question of the Month Answer:


During November we had 708AD, 708AT and 7073T operating from Yemen. When was the last DXpedition to Yemen?

Answer: C. 2012

In April and May of 2012, a large Russian/American team of DX'ers operated as 706T from Sococtra Island, Yemen. A previous DXpedition operated in 2002.

Yemen is currently No. 35 on Clublog's Most Wanted List for North America and No. 44 Worldwide.
